Welcome to our new Head of School


I am Mrs Roberts and I am very excited to be joining Riverside Academy as the new Head of School in January.








Attendance

Our Year 1 children have made it to the end of the Autumn term. This is always a very busy term for our children, with lots of new things to get used to. Each child has shown hard work, commitment and growth and we are so proud.

In English we have been learning to plan our own amazing adventures for Stickman. The children had so many fantastic ideas about where Stickman went and they did a brilliant job in writing their own stories. In maths we have been regularly practising our number formation as well as learning to add and subtract using a number line. We have also dug deeper into 2D and 3D shapes by exploring their properties in different ways such as shape hunts, songs, making shapes and using them to complete challenges. This half term, we learnt about Birstall in our geography topic. We identified human and physical features on a map and by going on a detective walk around our school. In science, we have learnt about Autumn and more recently what types of weather we may get. Our PE topics have led us to develop our core muscles through gymnastics and movement through dance. In DT, we made moving pictures and used this to turn our Stickman story adventures into moving books!

Our term has come to an end with lots of festive activities that all our children have enjoyed. Firstly, thank you for attending decorations morning. We had so many family members attend and help create some fantastic decorations which we all hope are on display in your homes! The children had a fantastic time making ornaments to hang and crafting wreaths and Santa faces. The Year 1 Christmas carol Concert was a delight! The children had lots of fun learning all their songs, making hats to wear and decorations to sell. Thank you to everyone that showed us their support.

English

In English we have been exploring *Journey and Stone Age boy*. The children have been developing their imagination and creativity to write their own stories. They have also been using their knowledge of the Stone Age to write explanation text. These last two weeks the children have been writing the story of The Bear and The Hare using lots of descriptive language.

Maths

In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division. The children have been using their skills across the 2s, 4s and 8 times table. We are incredibly proud of how hard they are working.

Art/ French

We have been learning various sketching techniques in our Art lessons such as hatching, crosshatching and stippling and the children have thoroughly enjoyed forming 'Human sentences' that contain adjectives in French! Tres bien!

PE

In PE, we have been learning how to play netball and using the different skills. The children have thoroughly enjoyed playing against each other in a netball game. We have also been practising our rhythm in our Drumba lessons.

Wow! What another exciting and jam packed half term it has been for Year 4. All pupils have continued to engage with their learning across the curriculum. We are incredibly proud of all our Riverside superstars for working so hard, over such a long term too!

English

Our English lessons have focused on the completion of the narrative of Edward Tulane with the writing of Edward's character description and how his character has changed. Edward has experienced the most amazing journey of self-discovery and hope. But most of all, love. Children have had to really consider the feelings and emotions of Edwards journey and justify their own thoughts about his character. I wonder if your child/children can express and retell the adventures Edward has been on and how this affected his character.

Children have also written non-chronological reports about Leicester. They engaged with proactive research using technology, planned their reports and published them onto posters.

Character Award

The Character Award has been a fantastic opportunity for the children to develop personally and work collaboratively in overcoming a variety of different weekly challenges. Are they able to identify and discuss their own journey of personal growth and development, like Edward Tulane, by discussing the following reflective questions?

- 1. What challenges did you face during the Character Award activities? How did you overcome them?
- 2.Can you think of a time when you helped someone else in your team? How did it make you feel?
- 3. What new skills or strengths have you discovered about yourself?
- 4. How do you think you've grown as a person since starting the Character Award?
- 5. What are you most proud of achieving, and why?

Maths

In Maths, our focus has been on multiplication and division and really embedding these key skills through exciting practical activities and theory-based learning. We explored how to use arrays, grouping, sharing and to complete problem-solving challenges. We continue to practice our times tables knowledge to improve our recall speed and accuracy. We used real-life examples, like sharing items equally or arranging objects into groups, to understand how multiplication and division work. Children have been able to explain their thinking and use what they have learned to tackle questions with confidence. It's been a fun and busy half term in maths and we're proud of how much we've achieved!





Science

This term, the children have been buzzing with excitement as they explored the fascinating world of electricity! The children have truly enjoyed every moment of their learning journey, which has been packed with discovery and hands-on activities.

Our young scientists began by identifying common appliances that run on electricity, sparking curiosity about how they work. They then took on the challenge of constructing simple series electrical circuits, confidently naming basic components such as wires, batteries, bulbs, and switches. It was incredible to see their teamwork and problem-solving skills in action!

To take their understanding even further, the children conducted an experiment to investigate conductors and insulators. They tested various materials, discovering which ones allow electricity to flow and which ones block it. Their enthusiasm and inquisitiveness were inspiring as they drew conclusions from their observations.

It has been wonderful to see the children's excitement and engagement throughout the term. We are so proud of their hard work and curiosity, and we can't wait to see where their learning will take them next!
